

## **ELECTION PROCEDURES: CISV International Honorary Counsellors (HC)**

### **ELIGIBILITY AND CONSIDERATIONS**

- Any person who has at least 15 years of experience working in CISV International and has served for at least six years as a members of the Expanded Executive of CISV International may be nominated to the position of Honorary Counsellor.
- They are elected by the CISV International Board (“Board”) to recognize their distinguished service to CISV International.
- Honorary Counsellors should be individuals with significant experience in the administration of CISV International who have decided to reduce their level of active participation in the work of CISV International.
- They are elected so that their expertise and global perspective can be shared for the benefit of CISV.
- This honour should be limited and granted only after careful consideration, in order to guarantee that it remains a position of respect and importance in the CISV family.

### **NOMINATION**

- In order to be considered, an individual must be nominated by at least three National Associations. The nomination should be made during an Annual International Meeting (AIM) and the election should take place during the following AIM.
- A nomination must contain biographical information about the nominee, including his or her history of CISV involvement. A nominee must agree to be nominated and to serve as an Honorary Counsellor if elected.

### **VOTING**

The nominee must receive an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board, present or not, in order to be elected. A vote on a nomination takes place at following AIM.
